



Coast Guard and Department of Defense Memorandum of Understanding

The DoD will ensure that the USCG is:

- ✓ Included in the DoD Voluntary Education Programs DANTES managed contracts that support continuing education opportunities for Service members voluntary education for the military services with the provision that the USCG provides the funding.
- ✓ Ensure that the USCG receive services from the DANTES managed contracts: include:
 - 1)The Military Voluntary Education Review (MVER) contract . This contract will assess the quality of the educational services and programs received from institutions providing distance learning (DL) programs to the Coast Guard.
 - 2)The Servicemembers Opportunity College (SOC) contract with the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. This contract will facilitate the maximum transferability of college credits among SOC member schools.
 - 3)The American Council on Education Registry Transcript which will ensure that the Coast Guard Institute transcript be recognized as an official source for college credit.
- ✓ Ensure that the USCG is provided access to the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES) for testing/examination programs and services.
- ✓ Ensure that the Coast Guard's appointed representative is included in the InterService Voluntary Education Board.
- ✓ Ensure that the USCG is a participant in the DoD Worldwide Education Symposium and has a representative on the planning committee and attends meetings in preparation for the Symposium.
- ✓ Ensure that the USCG is provided with access to the Voluntary Education Management Information System (VEMIS) for the purpose of collecting data with regards to tuition assistance participation and costs.

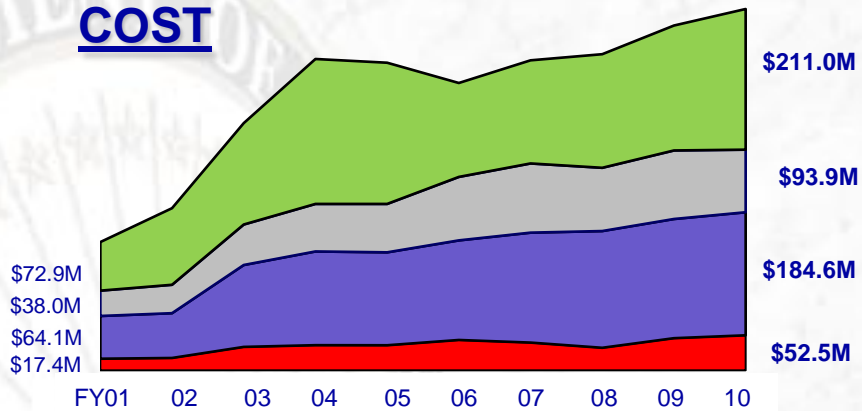
Coast Guard and Department of Defense Memorandum of Understanding

United States Coast Guard - The USCG will be responsible for the general administration and oversight of USCG programs, to include:

- ✓ **Provide representation and participation at planning committee meetings in preparation for the DoD Worldwide Education Symposium.**
- ✓ **Maintain policies and procedures that are directed by Title 10.**
- ✓ **Provide funding for the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES) for testing/examination programs and services.**
- ✓ **Provide funding for the Servicemembers Opportunity College (SOC) support services with regards to SOCCOAST.**
- ✓ **Incorporate DoD policy that addresses “good practices” of educational services delivery.**
- ✓ **Maintain standards established by the DoD for accountability of educational programs to include: accreditation, operating a voluntary educational program and the DANTES examination program.**
- ✓ **Provide a representative to serve on the InterService Voluntary Education Board.**
- ✓ **Participate in the Military Voluntary Education Reviews (MVER) for the evaluation/assessment of all applicable voluntary education programs.**
- ✓ **Prepare and send an Annual Voluntary Education Program Report to the Office of Undersecretary of Defense, Personnel and Readiness, Military Community and Family Policy.**
- ✓ **Participate in DoD-wide data collection efforts in support of congressional and service related needs**

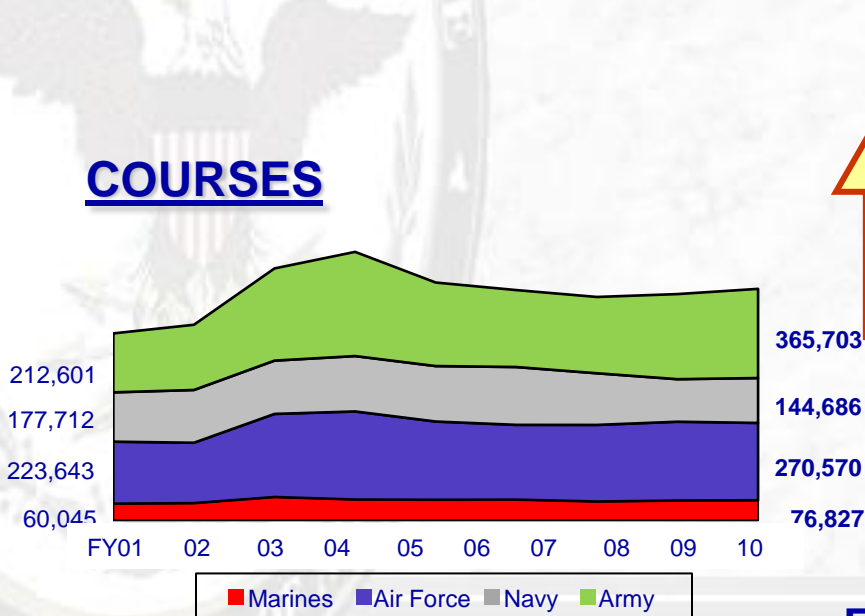

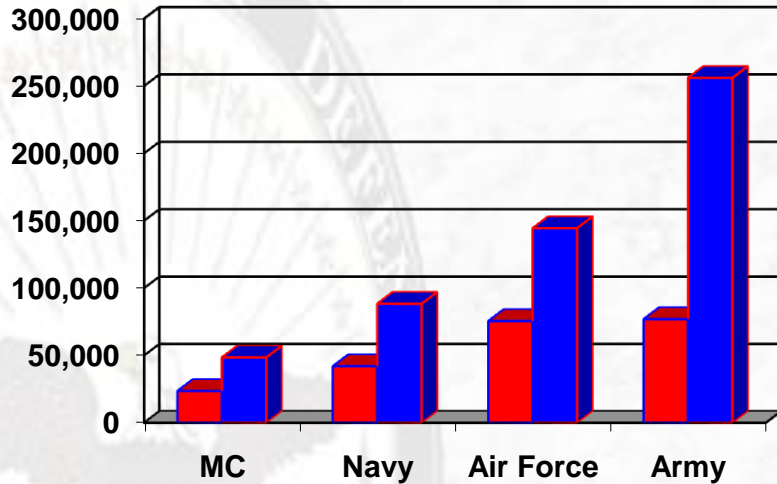

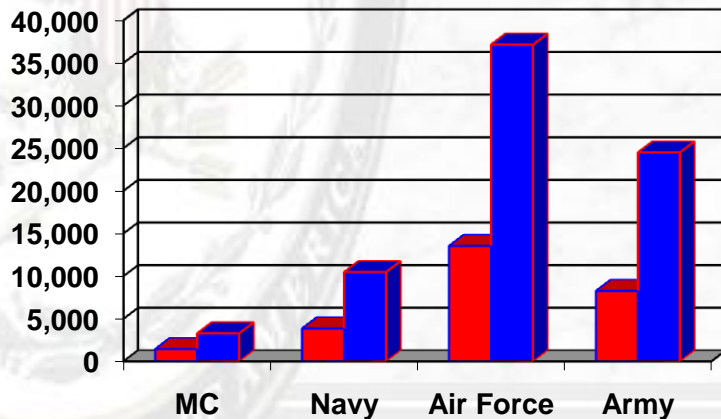
Undergraduate Courses

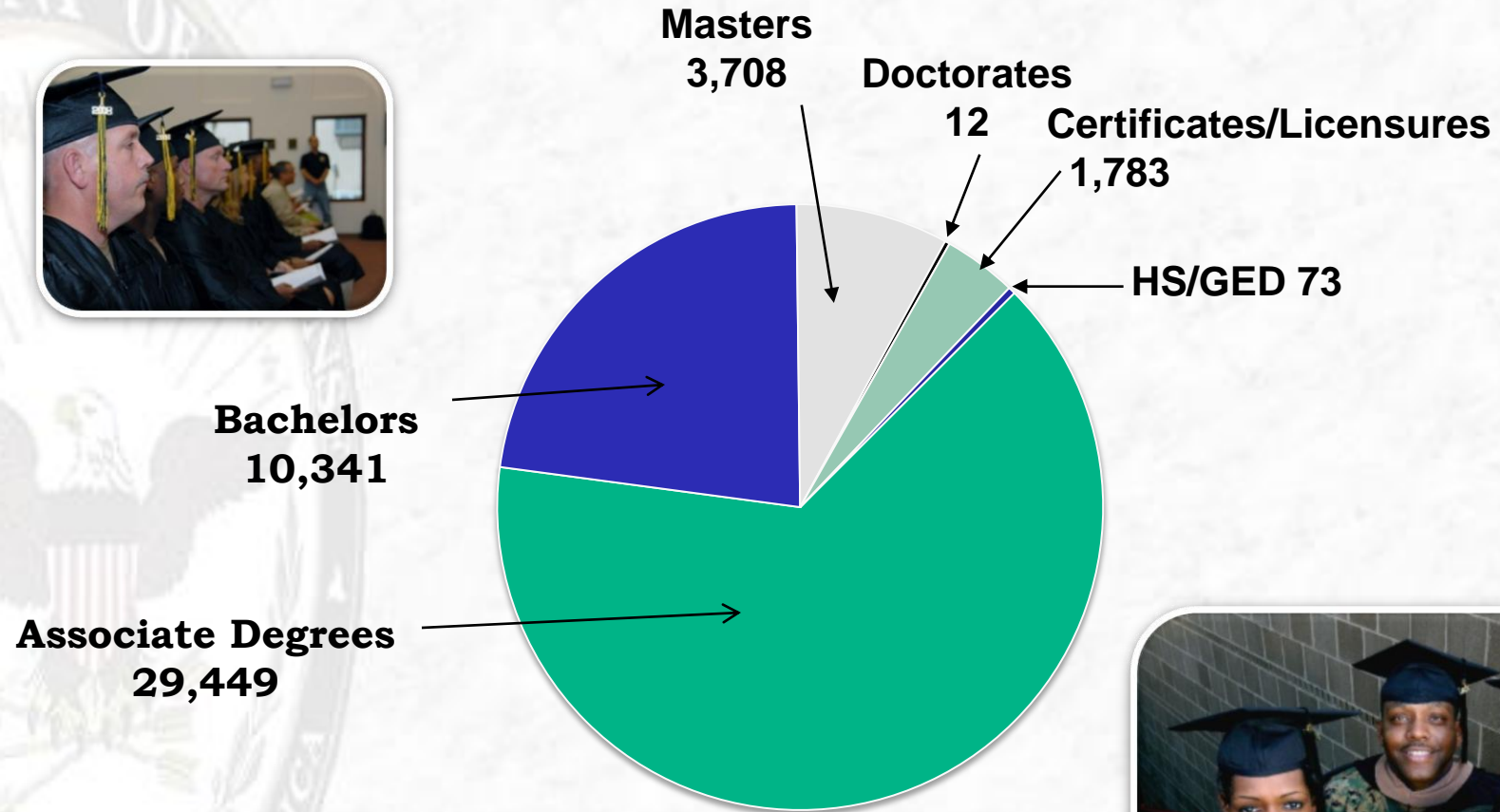

APPLICATION FOR DOD MOU

The revision to the DoD Instruction 1322.25, Voluntary Education Programs, includes an appendix containing the uniform DoD Voluntary Education Partnership MOU between DoD (OUSD, Personnel & Readiness) and Educational Institutions. The new instruction states all institutions providing high school completion and post secondary education programs through the DoD Tuition Assistance (TA) Program must agree to the new DoD MOU and have a signed copy on-file with DoD prior to Service members receiving TA approval to attend their institution.

Key MOU Points Institutions Must Agree To

- ✓ Support the regulatory guidance provided by DoD and the Services
- ✓ Adhere to and execute Servicemembers Opportunity College (SOC) Principles and criteria
- ✓ Participate in the military Voluntary Education Review Process (MVER)
- ✓ Provide the same tuition cost for all Service members enrolled in the same course, regardless of the Service component, per OPEID number.
- ✓ Recognize, accept, and award credit where appropriate, from the Army/American Council on Education Registry Transcript System, the Sailor/Marine American Council on Education Registry Transcript System, the Community College of the Air Force (CCAF), as the official sources of military training and experience documentation with corresponding college credit recommendations, when processing the individual's documented education plan
- ✓ Provide course enrollment, course withdrawal, course cancellation, course completion or failure, grade, verification of degree completion to the Service issuing tuition assistance based on the appropriate Service Addendum.
- ✓ Provide an evaluated educational plan to the Service member and his or her Service.
- ✓ Use the billing process as outlined in the Services' regulation and instructions and respective Service Addendums.

The MOU Does NOT

- Obligate any funds
- Guarantee enrollments by DoD personnel, their eligible adult family members, DoD civilian employees, and retirees in an educational institution's academic programs
- Grant access onto a military installation to market the institution, counsel students or provide instruction
- Take the place of an installation MOU
- Grant access to United States (US) military installations outside of the continental US

- Institutions and DoD sign MOUs
- Institution Participation List - listing all institutions with signed MOUs posted to the MOU Web page.

1 January 2012


- Policy effective
- After 1 January 2012, institutions without a signed MOU will NOT be eligible to receive DoD TA funds.

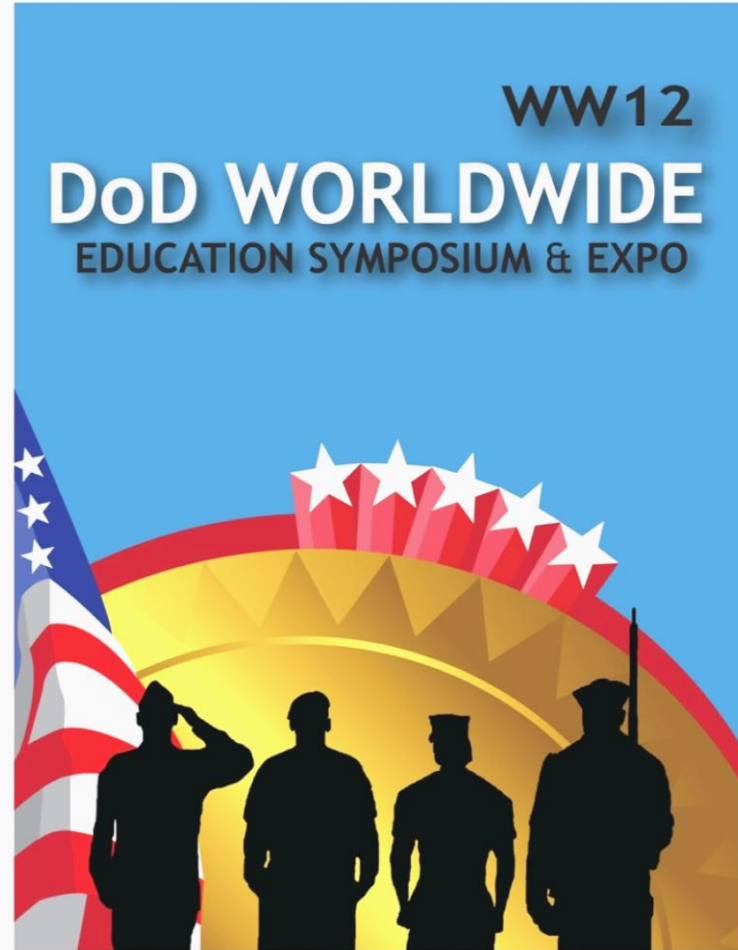
