Homeland Security

▶ Unique classes to include:

- ❖ CJ210 – Global Comparative Justice, focuses on Islamic law in comparison to U.S. law
- ❖ CJ227L – Computer Investigations
- ❖ CJ230 – Introduction to Terrorism – Strategic Security
- ❖ CJ245 – Multi-Cultural Communication, focuses on cultures in and out of the U.S.
- ❖ CJ340 – Organized Crime

Homeland Security

▶ Unique classes to include:

- ❖ CJ355 – Legal Issues in Homeland Security, focuses on International and Federal Law
- ❖ CJ415 – Domestic & International Terrorism, focuses on major terrorist groups, funding and beliefs
- ❖ CJ435 – Emergency Planning, focuses on CJ agencies role in emergency preparation and response
- ❖ CJ485 – Homeland Security, focuses on operational, legislative, and administrative components. Analysis of Patriot Act and uses Red Teaming exercises
